Re: Approval of Online CME Programming for Paramedics

I am writing to advise that the College has approved a number of the 24/7 EMS training videos submitted by your agency for use as Continuing Medical Education for Saskatchewan Paramedics (see attached). The approval will extend to December 1, 2010 at which time it will be reviewed and could then be extended for a longer period. You will be asked to update the information you provided at that time and we will be seeking feedback from users as well.

All submitted courses have been approved for 5 CME credits with the exception of those listed below. All students should be encouraged to supplement the 24/7 Courses with review of the applicable Saskatchewan Emergency Treatment Protocols.
