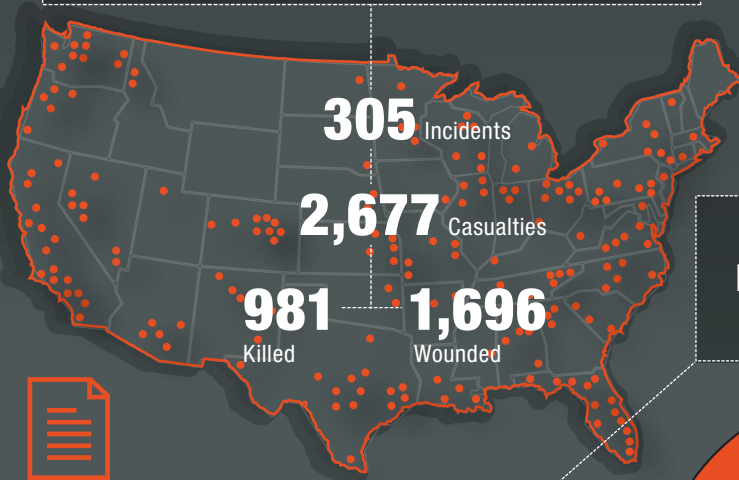


## ACTIVE SHOOTER INCIDENTS

### AFTER A SEVERE INJURY

a person can bleed to death in as little as

**3 minutes.**

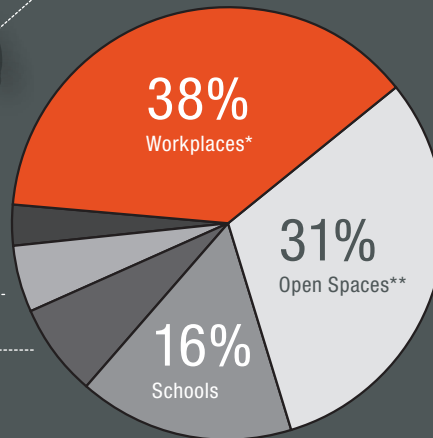


**80%** of victims of mass casualty events rely on members of the public for transportation to the hospital.



### INCIDENTS CAN HAPPEN ANYWHERE

(2000-2019):



**67%** of all active shooter incidents ended before police arrived.



### THE OSHA GENERAL DUTY CLAUSE

Under the Occupational Safety and Health Act of 1970 (the OSH Act, or the Act), companies must maintain a safe workplace away from violence for all employees.

3% Residences  
5% Houses of Worship  
7% Government

**70%** of active shooter incidents ended in **5 minutes** or less.

Identify areas of threat



Have a plan of attack or escape
